<b>Sentence #1</b>	The burglar <b>must have got in</b> through the bathroom window.		
<b>Form:</b>	<b>must</b>	<b>have</b>	<b>got in</b>
	Modal	Auxiliary	Phrasal Verb (Past Participle)
	... + <i>must have</i> + past participle		
<b>Meaning:</b>	To draw a conclusion that explains a present situation based on some evidence		
<b>Context:</b>	[Picture/Cartoon]: Two policemen talking in front of a broken window of a house that was broken into. They can have speech bubbles above them, with one of them saying "The burglar must have got in through the bathroom window."		
<b>CCQs:</b>	How did the burglar get it? Why do they think he got in this way? Are they right to think he got in this way? Is he in there now? How certain do you think they are? Would they be 90% certain?

<b>Form:</b>	I	would rather	you	didn't	tell
	Subject	Modal phrase	Object	Auxiliary	Base form of the verb
	Subject + <i>would rather</i> + object + did/didn't + base form + ...				
<b>Meaning:</b>	To politely express a preference to someone (often as a suggestion not to do something).				
<b>Context:</b>	[Dialogue]: A small story can be read where-by one friend (Ann) witness something their friend (Barry) shouldn't be doing – maybe snacking while they are on a diet.				
<b>CCQs:</b>	Is Y embarrassed? What would Ann do? What does Barry want Ann not to do? Does Barry want her to tell?
