Form:	The job	went to	the man	,	who	was	40
	Subject	Verb	Object	Indicates a non-defining relative clause	Pronoun (clause)	Past Simple (clause)	Noun (clause)
	Subject + Verb + Object + comma + clause						
Meaning:	The non-defining relative clause is to provide extra information about the object that doesn't change the meaning of the sentence						
Context:	[A picture of a 40 year old having a job interview] Students should then be told that the man got the job and the sentence "The job went to the man, who was 40" is written on the board.						
CCQs:	How many people went to the interview? How old was the man who was hired? Was the man successful?

Sentence #9	My plane leaves at 6:30.			
Form:	My	plane	leaves at	6:30
	Adjective	Subject	Verb	Object
	Adjective + subject + verb + object / My plane leaves at X			
Meaning:	The use of the present simple here is to show that something is a schedule			
Context:	A dialogue or listening can take place where two people are talking about their travel and holiday plans. One of them should mention that their plane leaves at 6:30.			
CCQs:	At what time will the plane take off? Has the plane left?
