<b>Form:</b>	She	had	her	teeth	whitened	before	her	wedding
	Pronoun – Subject	Past Simple – Verb	Possessive Adjective	Noun – Object	Past Participle	<i>Subordinate Conjunction</i>	Adjective	Noun
	<i>Independent Clause + Subordinate Conjunction + Dependent Clause</i>							
<b>Meaning:</b>	The Independent Clause can be stated alone but the Dependent Clause relies on the Independent Clause and provides extra information. This is also the use of the Causative Passive (to cause someone else to get something done for you).							
<b>Context:</b>	An article about brides who are getting their teeth whitened (or some stories/testimonials of women who had their teeth whitened for their wedding day)							
<b>CCQs:</b>	Which was first, the wedding, or, the teeth whitening? Why did she whiten her teeth? Did she do it herself? Did the dentist clean her teeth? Who did the cleaning?
